Software: Donor Perfect 2017-2021 **Previous Software:** QuickBooks

Reason for exploring new donor software:

- QuickBooks lacked an easy mail merge output and reporting.
- We needed integration donation form options for our website.

Cost & Choosing Software:

- In 2017 WAHS looked at four products and Donor Perfect seems to have great reviews and was affordable.
- Four years later, WAHS currently has 9000 constituents in our system, and we are charged roughly \$4,000 annually. Their billing based on number of donors in the system.
- There are also transaction fees as well per transaction. You must use their payment processor and fees seem comparable to others.

Things WAHS loves about Donor Perfect:

- Very easy to use. Easy onboarding. Good interface.
- Customer service is always available. There is a chat box with live people. WAHS often uses this rather than a phone call if we are having trouble figuring out a report template.
- Comprehensive reporting. Pretty much any report you could want exists.
- Forms: You can create donation forms and put code into your website. Easy to use with little coding experience.
- Nice In Memory tools and response generation.
- Easy ability to send bulk letters and emails in response to donors.
- Ability to track pledges for a capital campaign.
- Monthly donation management and communications.
- Customized response emails.

Things we wish were better:

- Not many integrated analytics. They are just starting to offer some analytics. But it is additional cost. I have not explored this yet.
- Lacks any crowd-raising team fundraising abilities. We use one-cause to handle our virtual team fundraising and online auctions.
- Wish there were a more seamless way to integrate into QuickBooks. So, we don't have to do double data entry. We need to explore this more as well.

Who WAHS thinks it would be good for:

Donor perfect is great for a small organization with under three people in their development team. It is easy to use and is not over-engineered. If you want to graduate from using excel or QuickBooks to track donations this is a nice upgrade
